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
This guide has been designed with you in mind! Our goal is to provide you with questions and resources that will help you dig deeper and cultivate spiritual growth, whether you choose to go through this individually, as a family, or in a small group.

Each week starts out with an *introduction* to the sermon, the *main points*, and the *key takeaway*. We've included a *notes* section to jot down ideas and thoughts that stand out during the sermon.

Next up is the *family discipleship* page. Proverbs 22:6 tells us to "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." Parents, use this guide as a way to connect with your children through studying God's Word together. The time you spend together in Scripture will make an eternal impact.

From there, we move into a watch + read + discuss section designed to provide supplemental resources for you. If you're using this guide as a group, this section is perfect for additional study together.

Remember that this is just a guide. If you don't get through every question or outside resource, that's okay! Choose the ones that work best for you and your group. If you think of a better question, ask it! If you find additional resources that you want to pull in, great! Our prayer is that this guide will serve as a starting point to help you spark deeper, more meaningful conversations and relationships with others and, most importantly, with Christ.



Proverbs is a collection of wise sayings and poems.

Most of the proverbs are attributed to Solomon, but Agur and King Lemuel are also credited with their own sections.

Proverbs was compiled and arranged after Israel's return from exile in Babylon around the 5th to 4th century B.C.E.

- 1 The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel:
- 2 for gaining wisdom and instruction; for understanding words of insight;
- 3 for receiving instruction in prudent behavior, doing what is right and just and fair;
- 4 for giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young—
- 5 let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance—
- 6 for understanding proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise.

People desperately want to "win" at life. They want to succeed in everyday life, and Christians are no different. We search frantically for tips from books, from "experts" on TV, the internet, TikTok or anywhere we can find them. The problem is that many Christians look everywhere but the Bible to learn how to "win" at parenting, finances, marriage, the workplace, and other areas of life.

Even Christians who want a "Christian" perspective on these topics are more likely to look to a Christian book than to the Book—the Bible! So often we don't want the Word. Instead, we want practical tips and strategies that have been plucked from the world. Sure, we believe the Bible is God's Word and it's authoritative, but we somehow buy into the misconception that it doesn't do a great job of addressing the nitty-gritty details of daily life. So Christians will do no more than skim the Word devotionally to get some helpful tips for their day. The philosophies of the world primarily shape and fashion their worldview.

However, the problem doesn't stop there. The problem is that even if we do look to the Book, and even if we do somehow pull out some tips for how to live a better life, more often than not we don't follow what we already know. Oftentimes we know what to do, but we can't bring ourselves to do it.

- Think of how often we mess up.
- Think of the hurtful words you've said to a friend or your spouse or your parents.
- Think of the times you've said more than you should say.
- Think of the times you spoke too quickly and couldn't get your words back.

- Think about the time someone confronted you with something you needed to hear, and in anger you blew them off with, "Who do you think you are?!"
- Think about the times you should've lovingly confronted someone and didn't.
- Think about that person whose feelings you hurt.
- Think about that lie you desperately hope your parents won't find out or your boyfriend won't find out or your wife won't find out.
- Think about those things you keep hidden.
- Think about that secret that you just couldn't keep to yourself, and in a moment of supposed confidential privacy you whispered in someone's ear, "Well, did you hear what happened to . . .?"
- Think about the times you've bragged about yourself so others would think you're something.
- Think about the mistakes you've made with your children.
- Think about the times you didn't discipline a behavior that has now gotten out of hand.
- Think about the times your children saw you do something you had told them not to do or heard you say something you told them not to say.
- Think about that grudge you've held and refused to let go because someone really hurt you.
- Think about the times you've been stingy with your money instead of generous to a person with a real need.
- Think about the frivolous spending that got you in trouble.
- Think about the get-rich-quick scheme that ruined you.
- Think about the times you didn't finish your job assignment on time because you got sidetracked by Facebook.
- Think about the people you're jealous of because they got the promotion that passed you by.
- Think about the times you've nagged or ignored helping your spouse.
- Think about how you repeat the same stupid mistake over and over and don't learn from it.

On and on and on we could go.

What does all of this tell us? It tells us that we have a major problem that no amount of tips will solve. It tells us that we are not wise and are often foolish. It tells us that we are broken and don't work right. It tells us that we are in desperate need of wisdom to make decisions and navigate our way through life. But we can't just say that we need wisdom and then go after it. Since we are broken, we don't even follow the wisdom we already know. We do things we know are hurtful and foolish. We just can't help ourselves. Proverbs is all about becoming wise in everyday life through a relationship with Jesus—through the gospel. It's about the life of the kingdom that God always meant for humankind to live. When our vertical relationship with God is right through Jesus, we can be right with others and the world around us.





BIG IDEAS

• In the book of Proverbs, we read about 800 Proverbs attributed to Solomon. Historically, he is credited with writing over 3,000. Solomon spent a lifetime gaining the knowledge he has written down for you and me to follow. It is a collection of truths learned over a lifetime of experiences. Although society has changed, the encounters in which he lends sound advice have not. His advice is as relevant today as it was when it was written. The truth we find in the Bible is the truth of God and everything points to Christ. We cannot have wisdom without Christ.



• Learning, guidance, wisdom, instruction, and understanding are prevalent words in the first six verses of chapter one, regardless of the version of the Bible you are reading. These words go beyond knowledge alone. Wisdom takes knowledge and puts it into action. We can not live a life pleasing to God if we aren't living by His Word.

FAMILY DISCUSSION



Verse four talks about knowledge and discretion to the youth. As parents, we often do a good job with passing knowledge but lack teaching discretion. How do we define discretion and how it relates to the way we deal with our neighbors?



Asking questions and sharing are great ways to keep the family connected. Kids, what are some things you are going through right now that you are unsure of how to handle or need a different perspective? Share that with your trusted adults. Parents, we all have those memories of events that have happened in our lives that we wish we would have handled differently. Think of an experience and pertinent piece of wisdom that might be worth sharing at this point in your child's life.




7 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.

INTRODUCTION

We all view the world in a certain way—through a certain lens. However, the fall of humankind into sin has assured that we do not see the world rightly. We don't view the world the way it really is, so we make wrong decisions that go against the grain of how the world really is. However, if we will observe the world through the lens that God has given in fear of Him, we can start perceiving how things really are. And once we start living according to that pattern, we will walk in wisdom.

Getting wisdom is important because it will help you make decisions in everyday life. It will help you "win" at life. But failing to get wisdom will wreck your life. The problem for all of us is that we have failed repeatedly because even when we know what to do, we often don't do it. This reveals our brokenness. Where do we turn? What's the answer for us? How can we become wise when we are so broken we can't even do what we know is right?

Wisdom is a person—Jesus of Nazareth. Through a relationship with Him you can be reconciled to God, to others, and to the world around you. Through a relationship with Him, he will begin to produce in you the wisdom he lives out—the wisdom of Proverbs!







BIG IDEAS

• Fear and respect are two words that we often use exclusively but they certainly have a lot in common. When we respect something, we give it credit for what it is capable of. Weather is a powerful thing. We respect the seasons by preparing ourselves and our homes to endure the unique weather each season brings. In a harsh winter we bundle up. We make sure we have a good heating source. We keep things on hand like shovels and salt to make sure we have proper footing. We do these things because we know the power that winter can have. If we are not prepared, the winter can be terrible. Much in the



same way we need to respect God. We need to prepare to live a life that is pleasing to him each and every day, no matter the season.

• Within our church we are blessed to serve with brothers and sisters who have had a lot of life experience and that is truly a blessing. It is so important for us to live life as a body of believers. By doing life together, we can share our experiences with one another as Solomon has shared with us and give counsel to our brothers and sisters. We simply need to be willing to seek it.

FAMILY DISCUSSION



We all have loved ones in our lives that we know love us unconditionally, but whom we are afraid of disappointing. When we are little we are afraid of getting into trouble by our parents or guardians. We know they love us, but we also know that they have certain expectations for us while we are in their care. How is a parent's love similar to God's love for us?



Often in life we live without fear of things we know are coming when we should be preparing for them. Discuss an experience in your life that you weren't worried about and should have been. How did your lack of preparedness affect the outcome? What are some things we need to do to be prepared to walk with God on a daily basis?

- **Defining 'Fear of the Lord':** Amy Seiffert explains the "fear of the Lord" as a profound respect and reverence for God. How does this perspective influence your understanding of wisdom and knowledge?
- Personal Application: Reflecting on the video's message, in what areas of your life can you cultivate a deeper reverence for God to enhance your decision-making and understanding?

READ Colossians 1:9f

Compare Proverbs 1:7 with Colossians 1:9f. The wisdom that Paul wants to see from churches in the Colossae area is directly connected to God and His will. It is not just intellectual/mental like some Greek philosophies or later Gnosticism the early church struggled with. It results in a spiritual life (see Col 1:28, 2:1-3, 3:10). As FF Bruce said "Right knowledge leads to right behavior"; i.e. we live and act in a way that is worthy of our Lord (NICONT Colossians, Philemon and Ephesians, pg. 46). The proper attitude towards God is the first step of true knowledge, which is what is being said in Proverbs 1:7. Romans 1:28 makes clear what happens when we don't have that proper attitude; i.e. when God is not in the knowledge, "base mind" and "improper conduct" is the result.

PROVERBS 1:8-33

The Enticement of Sinners

- 8 Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and forsake not your mother's teaching,
- 9 for they are a graceful garland for your head and pendants for your neck.
- 10 My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent.
- 11 If they say, "Come with us, let us lie in wait for blood;
 - let us ambush the innocent without reason;
- 12 like Sheol let us swallow them alive, and whole, like those who go down to the pit;
- 13 we shall find all precious goods, we shall fill our houses with plunder;
- 14 throw in your lot among us; we will all have one purse"—
- 15 my son, do not walk in the way with them; hold back your foot from their paths,
- 16 for their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed blood.
- 17 For in vain is a net spread in the sight of any bird,
- 18 but these men lie in wait for their own blood; they set an ambush for their own lives.
- 19 Such are the ways of everyone who is greedy for unjust gain; it takes away the life of its possessors.

The Call of Wisdom

- 20 Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice;
- 21 at the head of the noisy streets she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks:

- 22 "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple?
 - How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?
- 23 If you turn at my reproof, behold, I will pour out my spirit to you; I will make my words known to you.
- 24 Because I have called and you refused to listen, have stretched out my hand and no one has heeded.
- 25 because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof,
- 26 I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when terror strikes you,
- 27 when terror strikes you like a storm and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.
- 28 Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently but will not find me.
- 29 Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the Lord,
- 30 would have none of my counsel and despised all my reproof,
- 31 therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way, and have their fill of their own devices.
- 32 For the simple are killed by their turning away, and the complacency of fools destroys them;
- 33 but whoever listens to me will dwell secure and will be at ease, without dread of disaster."

WISDOM: ASCEPTED OR DECLINED PROVERBS 1:8-33

INTRODUCTION

Hellfire and brimstone preaching can be harsh, and there are definitely wrong ways to do it. Many people can use the threat of hell as a way to manipulate people into making decisions. But many people preach with this kind of passion—like our group leader—because they really do love people and do not want them to perish. We can debate the most effective methods of evangelism and the best ways to go about it, but what we can't debate is that there is an urgent need to plead with those headed toward destruction to repent and believe the gospel.

Shockingly, in Proverbs 1:20-33 Wisdom is presented as a "turn or burn" street preacher who appeals to "the inexperienced" to turn and not perish. Wisdom warns that we are heading for disaster because of our foolishness and brokenness. Wisdom pleads with us to repent. This passage is essential to rightly understanding the book of Proverbs and the biblical concept of wisdom. Ultimately, wisdom is not a set of ideas; wisdom is a person—Jesus Christ. You need to begin a personal relationship with him by faith. If you do, he will forgive your sin and give you his Spirit. This will lead you to wisdom for abundant life here and eternal life hereafter. But rejecting Wisdom—Jesus—will wreck your life here and condemn you eternally hereafter. Whether or not you have a relationship with Jesus determines if you walk in wisdom or in a way that seems right to you.

BIG IDEAS

- Most of us have heard the saying that tells us not to put off tomorrow what we can do today. That is sound advice and can apply to a lot of things. The most important thing, however, is our salvation. Putting off the dishes or laundry is just an inconvenience. Putting off salvation has eternal consequences. Living for God and by his word is such a blessing. Any truly committed believer will tell you they can't imagine life without His presence.
- Often we are our own worst enemy. We let our pride get in the way of our growth because we don't like to be wrong. Salvation is not an admittance of doing something

wrong, it is accepting the only thing that is right. Satan is who sews seeds of doubt. He does not want anyone to turn to God. He is the one that fuels the fire of our prideful attitude. No one that matters will shame you for accepting Jesus Christ. Today is the day.



FAMILY DISCUSSION



What is something you have put off in your life that you should not have? What were the consequences of procrastination? What are the consequences of putting off what we know God is calling us to do?



In the related resources section, it mentions the Wise and Foolish Builders in Matthew and Luke. What is something in your life that you have tried to build on the wrong foundation? A friendship based on gossip. A relationship based on lust. Anything with a foundation other than Jesus Christ will not stand. How do you avoid those falls in your life? What are their consequences?

- Hearing and Doing: The video emphasizes that being wise is not just about hearing God's Word but also obeying it. What are some ways you can put God's teachings into practice in your everyday life?
- Storms of Life: Both builders faced storms, but only the house on the rock stood firm. What are some "storms" you've experienced in life, and how has your relationship with God helped you stay strong during those times?

READ Matthew 7:24-27 and Luke 6:46-29

Compare with the story of the Wise and Foolish Builders in Matthew (7:24–27) and Luke (6:46–49) How do both passages emphasize the importance of building a life on the right foundation? What are the similarities between Wisdom's call to repentance and Jesus' teaching about hearing and doing His words? Reflect on how each passage warns of the consequences of ignoring wisdom or building on a faulty foundation, and consider how these truths apply to your life today.



The Value of Wisdom

- 1 My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you,
- 2 making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding;
- 3 yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding,
- 4 if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures,
- 5 then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.
- 6 For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding;
- 7 he stores up sound wisdom for the upright; he is a shield to those who walk in integrity,
- 8 guarding the paths of justice and watching over the way of his saints.
- 9 Then you will understand righteousness and justice and equity, every good path;
- 10 for wisdom will come into your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul;
- 11 discretion will watch over you, understanding will guard you,

- 12 delivering you from the way of evil, from men of perverted speech,
- 13 who forsake the paths of uprightness to walk in the ways of darkness,
- 14 who rejoice in doing evil and delight in the perverseness of evil,
- 15 men whose paths are crooked, and who are devious in their ways.
- 16 So you will be delivered from the forbidden woman, from the adulteress with her smooth words,
- 17 who forsakes the companion of her youth and forgets the covenant of her God;
- 18 for her house sinks down to death, and her paths to the departed; [c]
- 19 none who go to her come back, nor do they regain the paths of life.
- 20 So you will walk in the way of the good and keep to the paths of the righteous.
- 21 For the upright will inhabit the land, and those with integrity will remain in it,
- 22 but the wicked will be cut off from the land, and the treacherous will be rooted out of it.



In life, we are bombarded with all kinds of voices and messages. These are human voices. They might be a parent, a teacher, a coach, a coworker, a friend, or a commercial, but these human voices have spiritual voices and messages that stand behind them. There are godly messages, and there are evil messages. These messages instruct us, exhort us, warn us, and make promises to us. The questions we must ask are, Whose voice will I listen to? What message will I trust as good and helpful? What message will I reject as bad and harmful?

God warns us and instructs us to keep us from harming ourselves—not to keep us from having fun. He wants what is best for us, and he doesn't want us to hurt ourselves. Will you listen to his voice? Or will you listen to the voice of another because it seems to offer more happiness at the time? The difference between the good life and the foolish life is the voice you heed. This is the key to Proverbs. Wisdom is a person—Jesus. Will you listen to him? If you will, he will make you wise. But we learn in Proverbs 2 that foolishness is also personal. There are voices in your ear, in your head, and the person Folly often stands behind them trying to get you to yield. Will you? Notice the competing voices in Proverbs 2:1-22.



BIG IDEAS

- There is a constant battle between good and evil going on all around us and even within us. God's word and His guidance can help us navigate the good from the evil. As humans, God's way isn't necessarily the most appealing all the time, but it is the one we must listen to. We are called no longer to live our own lives but to live by Him and for Him.
- Our daily focus should be on Christ and Christ alone.
 Living a life for Christ takes discipline. Athletes train to be successful at their sport. Firefighters, policemen, teachers, and doctors all go through rigorous training to be good at what they do. Christians are no different. We

- Influence of Voices in Our Lives: Ernest T. Bass is influenced by the people around him in his quest for "wisdom." How does this reflect the battle between good and evil voices described in Proverbs 2? How can we guard against folly and ensure we are listening to the right voices in our lives?

Seeking Wisdom from God: What does James say is necessary for receiving wisdom from God? How does this compare to the wisdom we often seek from other sources?

WISDOM BUILDS FRUST PROVERBS 3:13-35

Blessed Is the One Who Finds Wisdom

- 13 Blessed is the one who finds wisdom, and the one who gets understanding,
- 14 for the gain from her is better than gain from silver and her profit better than gold.
- 15 She is more precious than jewels, and nothing you desire can compare with her.
- 16 Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor.
- 17 Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace.
- 18 She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called blessed.
- 19 The Lord by wisdom founded the earth; by understanding he established the heavens;
- 20 by his knowledge the deeps broke open, and the clouds drop down the dew.
- 21 My son, do not lose sight of thesekeep sound wisdom and discretion,
- 22 and they will be life for your soul and adornment for your neck.
- 23 Then you will walk on your way securely, and your foot will not stumble.
- 24 If you lie down, you will not be afraid; when you lie down, your sleep will be sweet.

- 25 Do not be afraid of sudden terror or of the ruin of the wicked, when it comes,
- 26 for the Lord will be your confidence and will keep your foot from being caught.
- 27 Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it.
- 28 Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come again, tomorrow I will give it"—when you have it with you.
- 29 Do not plan evil against your neighbor, who dwells trustingly beside you.
- 30 Do not contend with a man for no reason, when he has done you no harm.
- 31 Do not envy a man of violence and do not choose any of his ways,
- 32 for the devious person is an abomination to the Lord, but the upright are in his confidence.
- 33 The Lord's curse is on the house of the wicked, but he blesses the dwelling of the righteous.
- 34 Toward the scorners he is scornful, but to the humble he gives favor.
- 35 The wise will inherit honor, but fools get disgrace.

WISDOM BUILDS FRUST PROVERBS 3:13-35

INTRODUCTION

When my daughter was very young, she would see commercials for toys or dolls or new trinkets, and she would exclaim, "I have to have that! Mom, can I get it? Dad, can I get it?" All the way to keeping a notebook by her side and writing down the 800 numbers! I remember asking her at Christmas time or birthday, "If you could only get one thing, which would you want?" I wanted to determine what her heart was set on above all else.

What about you? What one thing do you want most? What in life do you have to have? Often, commercials can awaken us to our desires. Maybe there are things you just have to possess, foods you just have to consume, or relationships you just have to have. What's the superior treasure in your life that you wake up thinking about, go to sleep dreaming about, and spend your day planning to get? It may be money, stuff, sex, success, or any number of things.

I'd rather have Jesus than silver or gold; I'd rather be His than have riches untold; I'd rather have Jesus than houses or lands.
I'd rather be led by His nailpierced hand Than to be the king of a vast domain Or be held in sin's dread sway. I'd rather have Jesus than anything This world affords today.

(Rhea F. Miller, "I'd Rather Have Jesus," 1922)

Wisdom—Jesus—is the treasure that is superior to all that we can set our hearts on. Solomon will tell us in Proverbs 3:13-35 to seek Wisdom first, above all else. When Solomon wrote these words he was encouraging his son to commit to study this book—Proverbs. But in the fullness of time, the Spirit has revealed to us that Wisdom is a person—Jesus Christ. We are to seek him—the pearl of great price—above all else, and all these other things will be provided for us (Matt 6:33). If we set our supreme desire on things—even good things—it will prove disappointing. It may even wreck our lives. But when we set our supreme desire on Jesus, we are able to enjoy these other things as gifts that cause our hearts to praise Jesus for providing them.



INTRODUCTION

Many people think of God like they think of Santa Claus. He judges you if you're naughty, and he rewards you if you're nice. Because of that misconception, much of modern Christianity consists of behavior modification. Many people think the main message of Christianity is "Stop doing bad things so God will like you, bless you, and take you to heaven instead of hell when you die. Heaven is for good people, and hell is for bad people; so be a good person and go to heaven not hell."

There are lots of problems with this understanding of Christianity. One, it is not biblical. Another is this: We cannot stop sinning. We cannot perfectly modify our behavior. Isn't this clear?

This is a problem for all of us. We are all sinners by nature, so we are all broken at the heart level and bent toward sin. That means we love things that God hates, and we hate things that God loves. So we can try to modify the behavior, but it won't bring lasting change because we are only treating the symptoms and not the source.

The behavior modification approach to Christianity has brought a lot of heartache. Behavior modification can either lead to depression when you can't fully address your problems or pride if you are able to solve your problems. These are both problematic. The answer for us according to Proverbs 4:20-27 is not behavior modification; it's that we need a new heart because the heart is the command center for life. The heart is the source for every behavior in your life, so in order to address sin and foolishness we must address them at the heart level. For us to obey God and walk in wisdom, we need a change at the heart level.



- The notion that good people go to heaven and bad people do not is a lie that the enemy has told us. We are all sinners, and even after we are saved, we will sin again. Christianity is not a story of good or bad, it is a story of redeemed and unredeemed. If you are bought with the blood of Christ Jesus, then you are a constant work in progress. Changing your heart through Godly principles, fellowship, counsel, and messages will continue the work that Christ started in you when he saved you.
- In football, the quarterback is often the heart of the offense. A good quarterback listens to the coach and knows the playbook. If he is able to keep his focus downfield, remain calm and make good decisions through all the noise and chaos then things usually go well. Our scripture this week tells us to do the same while walking with Christ. Listen to wise counsel and let it sink in. Wise counsel can be life changing. Guard your heart and stay away from the negativity. Choose the best path and don't get distracted. Stay focused on Christ.

Warning Against Adultery

- 1 My son, be attentive to my wisdom; incline your ear to my understanding,
- 2 that you may keep discretion, and your lips may guard knowledge.
- 3 For the lips of a forbidden woman drip honey, and her speech is smoother than oil,
- 4 but in the end she is bitter as wormwood, sharp as a two-edged sword.
- 5 Her feet go down to death; her steps follow the path to Sheol;
- 6 she does not ponder the path of life; her ways wander, and she does not know it.
- 7 And now, O sons, listen to me, and do not depart from the words of my mouth.
- 8 Keep your way far from her, and do not go near the door of her house,
- 9 lest you give your honor to others and your years to the merciless,
- 10 lest strangers take their fill of your strength, and your labors go to the house of a foreigner,
- 11 and at the end of your life you groan, when your flesh and body are consumed,

- 13 I did not listen to the voice of my teachers or incline my ear to my instructors.
- 14 I am at the brink of utter ruin in the assembled congregation."
- 15 Drink water from your own cistern, flowing water from your own well.

- 17 Let them be for yourself alone, and not for strangers with you.
- 18 Let your fountain be blessed, and rejoice in the wife of your youth,
- 19 a lovely deer, a graceful doe. Let her breasts fill you at all times with delight; be intoxicated always in her love.
- 20 Why should you be intoxicated, my son, with a forbidden woman and embrace the bosom of an adulteress?
- 21 For a man's ways are before the eyes of the Lord, and he ponders all his paths.
- 22 The iniquities of the wicked ensuare him, and he is held fast in the cords of his sin.
- 23 He dies for lack of discipline, and because of his great folly he is led astray.

One of the primary tactics of our enemy is to keep us distracted. He will often provide opportunities for us to take our eyes off of Jesus. He does so with various tactics.

Facing tough times is one of the main ways he works to shift our gaze from our Savior. It isn't the only way, however. Desires of this world are also something that tends to pull us away from our relationship with Jesus.

We learn in this proverb that things of the flesh are a primary deterrent in our lives, and just as with every other area of our lives, God's word has something to say about them.

Desires of the Flesh vs. Wisdom: It's a secular song, but it is interesting to think about "Simple Man" when comparing the perils of flesh to what we are promised comes with wisdom. The song talks about not overcomplicating life and focusing on simple truths. Proverbs 5 warns against the dangers of following fleshly desires, which often lead to destruction. How can focusing on the "simple" wisdom outlined in Proverbs help you recognize and resist the price of worldly desires in relationships, material pursuits, or other temptations that pull you away from Jesus?

READ James 1:14-15

Recognizing Temptation: James 1:14-15 explains how desires lead to temptation and, if unchecked, to sin. What desires in your life might be leading you toward temptation, and how can you address them before they give birth to sin?

"The Bible says that there is pleasure in sin (Hebrews 11:25). You can go out and drink and take drugs and have sex and all the rest of it—and have a lot of pleasure at it—but the Bible says it is only for a season. Then it is over. It leaves you bitter and finally destroys you. A day of reckoning always comes." Billy Graham

- 16 There are six things that the Lord hates, seven that are an abomination to him:
- 17 haughty eyes, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood,
- 18 a heart that devises wicked plans, feet that make haste to run to evil,

INTRODUCTION

"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words shall never harm me..." Such a catchy, quippy and totally untrue saying. Proverbs tells us repeatedly about the weight of our words; particularly when our words are dishonest.

In this passage, Solomon gives us the definition, the cause, the consequences and ultimately, how to overcome this ever-present, ever-dangerous area of temptation in our lives.



- 4 Say to wisdom, "You are my sister," and call insight your intimate friend,
- 5 to keep you from the forbidden woman, from the adulteress with her smooth words.
- 6 For at the window of my house I have looked out through my lattice,
- 7 and I have seen among the simple, I have perceived among the youths, a young man lacking sense,
- 8 passing along the street near her corner, taking the road to her house

- 27 Her house is the way to Sheol, going down to the chambers of death.



INTRODUCTION

God created his world good and everything worked right, including our physical relationships. But sin broke our relationship with God and with each other, so nothing right now works as it was designed. Instead of intimacy and satisfaction in marriage, there are distrust, barriers, and unfaithfulness. Sex is still a good, God-given gift, but it is not used properly because we are sinners. Fire can be both good and destructive. When it is in a fireplace, it can warm a house so you do not freeze in the winter, but when it is outside the fireplace, it will destroy the house. Like a fire, sex is very good in the right context (i.e., marriage) but very destructive in the wrong context. Because of our sinful nature, we use sex in destructive ways that God never intended.







WEEK 3: WISDOM: ACCEPTED OR DECLINED




During your time of prayer, think of those in your life that do not have a relationship with Jesus. Pray for the confidence to urgently plead with them to repent and form a relationship with Jesus.
